Printable Packing for Baby Checklist

☐ Ziplock bags to store snacks on the go

Wondering what to stash in your baby's bag — and yours — when you head off for a family vacation? Here's a complete cheat sheet for easy (if not lighter) family travel packing. Want to lighten your load?

What to Pack for Baby in the Carry-on Bag
☐ Diapers: two days' and nights' worth (in case you get stuck en route)
☐ Wipes, and lots of them
☐ A changing pad
☐ Two bibs
☐ Three baby blankets: Use them as burp clothes or to cover yourself up while breastfeeding
☐ Two bottles (if you use them)
☐ Change of clothes for your baby
□ Change of clothes for you (in case your baby spits up — or worse)
☐ Large ziplock bags to store soiled clothes in
☐ Several pacifiers (if your baby uses one)
■ Food: two small jars of baby food per meal, plus snacks if your baby is eating solids; easy-to-eat granola and cereal bars for you; formula if you're not breastfeeding
Activities: a couple of favorite toys and books plus a few brand-new ones
☐ Infant acetaminophen (or infant ibuprofen for babies older than six months old)
☐ Antibacterial wipes (to clean hands, wipe down meal trays or baby changing stations)
☐ Camera (with a battery charger or extra set of batteries)
What to Pack in Baby's Suitcase
■ Diapers and wipes
□ Diaper cream
■ Baby wash
□ Body lotion
□ Sunscreen
☐ Infant nail clippers (if you'll be away more than a week)
☐ A first-aid kit: Pack any medications your baby might need, bandages, an antibiotic ointment, your pediatrician's number, and outlet covers for babyproofing.
☐ Breast pump, plus storage for milk; or formula
☐ Baby food: a few jars (so you don't have to hit the supermarket the second you arrive)
□ Portable cooler and ice packs
☐ Two additional bottles
□ A bottle brush
☐ Infant utensils

☐ Clothes, socks, booties or shoes: Pack two outfits for each day you'll be away, plus two extra ones.
Lightweight stroller or baby carrier/sling
Car seat (Not traveling by car? You'll need one for the plane and/or the rental car or taxi)
Portable feeding seat (if your baby's sitting up and eating solids)
Monitor (if your baby will be sleeping in another room)
□ Night-light (if your child requires one)
□ Play mat
☐ Hot-weather gear: sun hat, sunglasses, swim diapers, and bathing suit
□ Cold-weather gear: snowsuit, coat, mittens, and winter hat
